Getting Started

List 1-2 aspects of the sermon that encouraged or challenged you.

Into the Bible

- 1) Read Matthew 28:1-7.** How does the reality of the empty tomb personally encourage or challenge you to share the Good News with others?
How does the angel's message, “He is not here, for He has risen,” shape your sense of urgency or boldness in evangelism?

Digging Deeper

- 2) Read Matthew 27:8-10.** The women encounter the risen Christ. How does their immediate worship and obedience model the response we should have to Jesus' resurrection? What might obedience to Jesus look like for you this week in reaching someone with the Good News?
- 3) Read Matthew 27:11-15.** These verses show Satan's efforts to suppress the truth. How does knowing that spiritual opposition exists affect your motivation to share the Gospel? Are there ways you've seen fear, lies, or distraction silence your witness? How can this passage help you overcome that?
- 4) Read Matthew 27:16-20.** Looking ahead to verses 16–20, Jesus gives the Great Commission. In what ways do His authority (“All authority...”) and His promise (“I am with you always”) encourage you to be faithful in sharing the Gospel?
